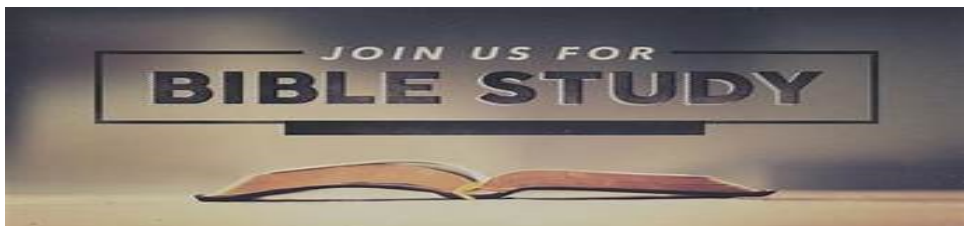
June 2nd Special Pre-Planned Hymns and Spiritual Songs Sing-a-Long!

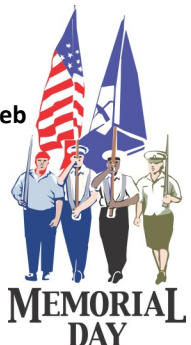

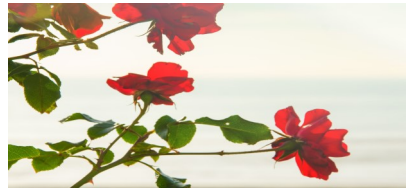

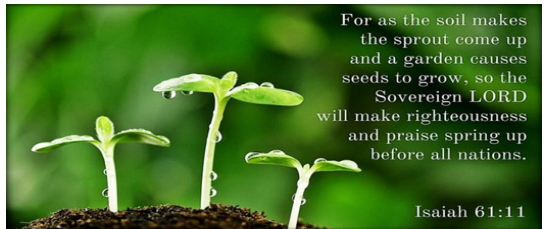

Many of us feel worried; we face a triple 'pandemic' of climate change, biodiversity collapse and pollution. Worse, those hardest hit are those who cause the least damage. Already, sea level rise is inundating nations, and yet, carbon emissions continue rising. Already the Brazilian Amazon has changed from carbon sink to carbon emitter. Melting permafrost is releasing methane. The devastating heat waves across India and Pakistan have led them to re-open coal mines. The war in Ukraine has increased the demand for new fossil fuel extraction. We are lost and confused.

On May 19, we celebrate Pentecost, commemorating the Holy Spirit's coming upon the apostles and others assembled in Jerusalem. We take time to remember that, after three incredible years of Jesus' earthly ministry, came the crucifixion, and these followers of Jesus, too, became lost and confused. They saw him tortured and murdered. Later, some said they saw him, touched him. Slowly they began to believe that it was true – he was alive! But then at the Ascension they were again left bewildered. He said, "I am calling YOU to be my witnesses; stay in Jerusalem until you are clothed with power." They thought they also might be killed if they mentioned Jesus' name.

But then, the day of Pentecost came. They were all in one place. Suddenly a sound came as of a rushing mighty wind, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. They arose and preached the Gospel. Many were added to their number. There were wonders and miracles. **They were transformed:** Though once scared, they became courageous. God gave them a mission, and enabled them to fulfill it.

We 21st Century Christians, too, have a mission: Both the Bible and the United Methodist Social Principles call us to care for God's beautiful world, the planet on which all people depend. What do we learn from Pentecost about how to take up this challenge? First, we must confess that we have not protected creation; then, we must commit to renewing Earth, and ask the Spirit to inspire and empower us in that task. From that point, the Holy Spirit can transform us, too, in this mission...

From selfish – to generous

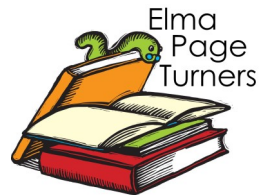
After Pentecost, the believers were together and had all things in common; they sold their possessions and distributed the proceeds to the needy.
